Please enjoy this edition of the Bailey Family Foundation Newsletter.

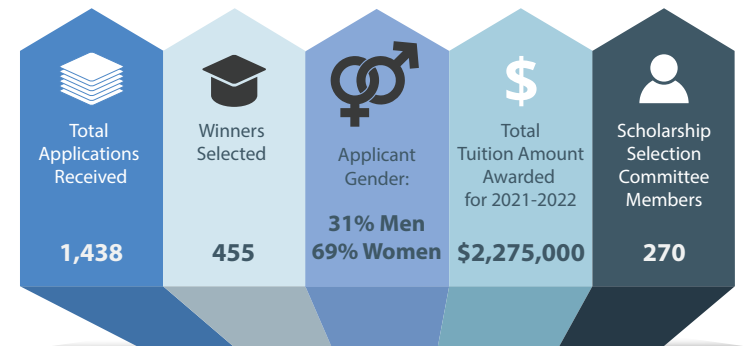

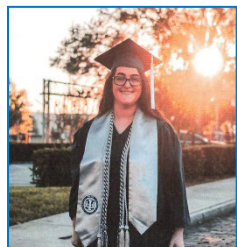
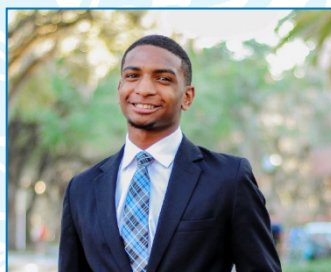
Descendants of George Patton Bailey:

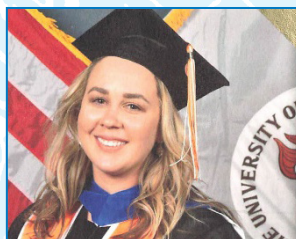


Barnes, Casey: graduated from Florida International University with a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology - Magna Cum Laude.

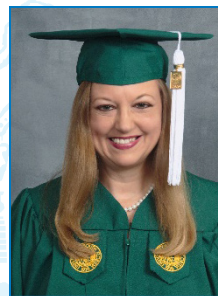

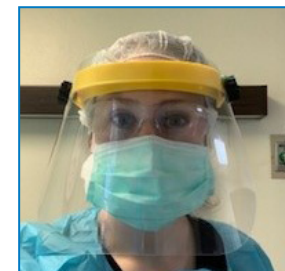
Walker, Erin: graduated from the University of South Florida with a Bachelor's Degree in Health Science with concentrations in Biological and Social/Behavioral Health Science.

Lily Bailey's artwork featuring Lily's grandmother Beverly Bailey (dec.) and newest granddaughter Hazel. The two have never met.

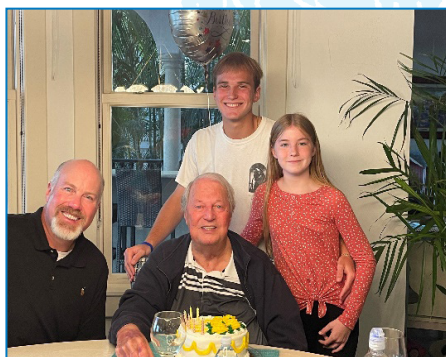
Ron Bailey turns 80!

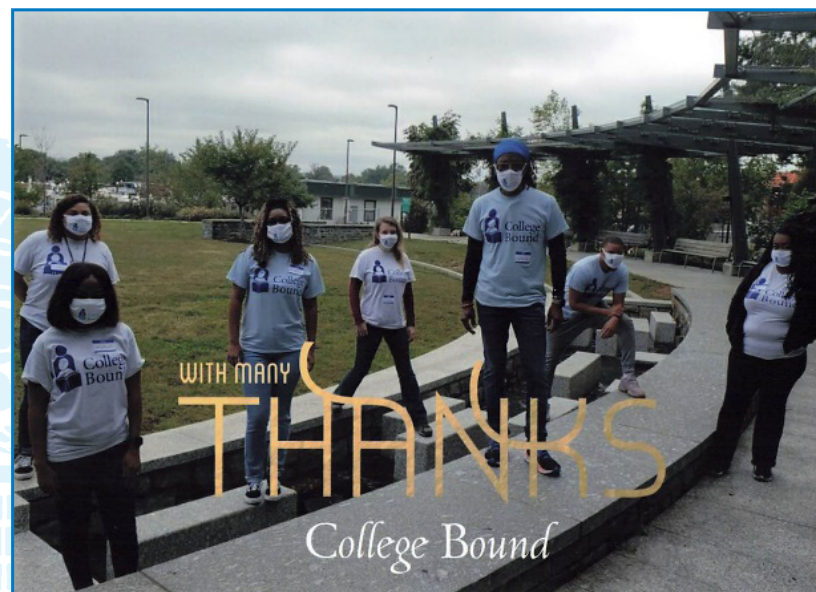
